The Clemente Course provides college level instruction in the humanities, with the award of college credits, in an accessible and welcoming community setting. Scholars study four disciplines: literature, art history, moral philosophy, and American history. Students explore great works of fiction, poetry, drama, painting, sculpture, architecture, and philosophy, while learning also about the events and ideals that define America as a nation. The course also offers instruction in writing and critical thinking, while the seminar style of the classes and dialectical investigation encourage an appreciation for reasoned dialogue.

Clemente classes are held at **Codman Square Health Center** on Monday and Wednesday evenings beginning September 2017 and running through June 2018. **Punctuality is a very important component of the program for you to achieve the desired outcome of your learning experience.
